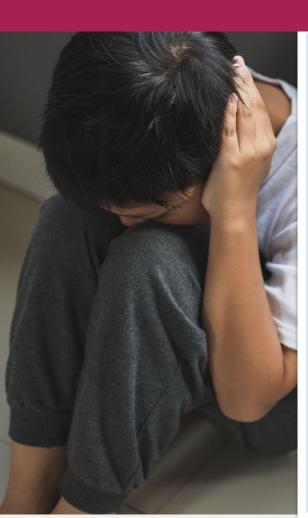

In 2021 the US Surgeon General publicly declared children's mental health a 'national emergency crisis' (see below for full statement).

This documentary film is intended to raise public awareness about this critical time sensitive issue that is affecting over 50 million children, and provide Harvard science research backed solutions that are immediately implementable and that are already proven effective.

In this Timely and Profoundly Impactful **90** minute documentary film, we reveal the children's mental health crisis in America and follow the stories of several children and school teachers in New York, Florida, Los Angeles and Maryland schools.

Inner city or lower socio-economic school districts are selected, based on locations we are already working with, to portray the most challenged children & teachers suffering and the critical need for a nationwide intervention.



We hear opinions and comments while asking high mileage questions to individuals in key decision-making positions, and individuals championing these issues for years.

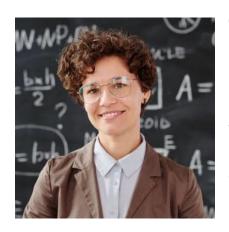




MEET THE CAST

Teacher 3: practices yoga and meditation as well as health nutrition habits personally, and has the skills and knowledge from herself practice and studies to maintain her mental health and emotional stability throughout the challenges she is facing within her classrooms and at home. She teaches yoga and meditation to the children in her classroom, and we are able to see and share the children's immediate and long lasting benefits from this intervention.



Child 1:

Minority ethnic female child, suffering from PTSD and/or depression. Shares the story about her journey before and after the CATF intervention in school and her new outlook on life.



Child 2: Minority ethnic male child, suffering from ADHD and/or anxiety / depression or suicidal consideration. Shares the story about his journey before and after the CATF intervention in school and his new outlook on life.



Child 3: Non-minority/Caucasian child, who has been raised with yoga, meditation and healthy nutrition/ loving home environment. Shares the story about her/his journey in school and her/his outlook on life because of this healthy foundation.





Expert 1: <u>Dr Sat Bir Khalsa</u> from Harvard, shares his 20 years of science research about the benefits of meditation and yoga for improving mental health, with MRI brain scans and medical perspective about why this intervention is the most beneficial solution for children and schoolteachers to solve the children's mental health crisis.





Expert 2: <u>Dashama</u>, founder of Flow State Institute and Bright Future foundation (Children are the Future initiative), shares her 17+ years' experience teaching and working with children, teachers and people of all ages, and some anecdotal information / stories about miraculous healing benefits of these practices for healing and optimal wellness.

Expert 3: Krishna Kaur, founder of Yoga for Youth foundation, shares her 24+ years' experience teaching and working with children, teachers, and people of all ages, in the school systems in America and shares anecdotal information / stories about miraculous healing benefits / stories of these practices for healing and optimal wellness for children.

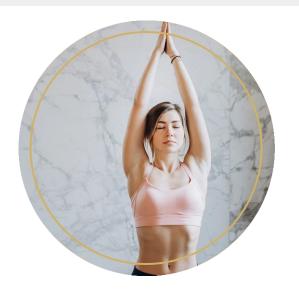




Expert 4: Yanna Darílis, Phys. Ed. & Fitness specialist, Integrative Nutritionist and Plant based specialist & ND, PhD in Original Medicine candidate- Broadcast producer, director, and host, shares her wisdom about the correlation between nutrition and children's mental health and emotional well-being and proposes solutions for changing the school meal plan and exercise regimen for optimal health and nourishment to support the CATF mission.

Expert 5: <u>Scarlett Lewis</u>, founder of Choose Love Movement, shares the story of her 6-year-old son Jesse who was shot and killed by a classmate at school and how she channeled her grief into creating the CLM, emotional intelligence training for children, which is a part of the CATF initiative and program, and currently offered in over 10,000 schools in America effectively.





Celebrity 1: Known public figure (female who has children who practice yoga) shares their view on the children's mental health crisis and how they feel the CATF intervention will impact the lives of children, teachers, and the future of humanity. (Example: Giselle or Hilaria Baldwin)

Administrator: <u>Jessica Newburn</u> (VP of all 1300 California charter schools) Shares her perspective of the current state of children's mental health crisis and the teachers burn out situation, emphasizing the dire necessity for this to be an immediate focus for philanthropists and funding to support CATF as the intervention / solution in all schools across the USA.

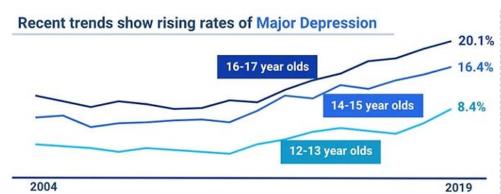


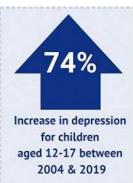
75% of all mental illnesses develop by age 24
